All pupils must wear a black blazer, with red piping and the academy logo.

Shirts/Blouses

Any retailer

All pupils must wear a white cotton shirt or blouse with a buttoned collar. This can be long or short-sleeved.

Trousers

Any retailer

Trousers for both girls and boys must be straight-legged, black polyester or cotton material.

Skirts

Only a black, pleated, knee-length skirt is to be worn. Black tights must be worn at all times.

Shoes

Any retailer

Shoes must be formal, all black, flat and without any buckles/logos or decorative features. No trainers are allowed.
