First Day

Our first day of school will be on Friday 3rd September and we would like our founding cohort to arrive from 8.00 am at the Eastgate site. Staff will be on hand to direct them where to go and there will be clear signage for the entrance in place. Please make sure they have full school uniform, including their founding member badges, a bag and basic equipment such as pens, pencil, and ruler. P.E kits will not be needed on the first day.

We will have a fully functioning kitchen ready to serve meals, children will receive a plastic card that they can swipe to pay for food, and it will also act as an identity badge. We will be using ParentPay to allow you to add money to their account prior to opening. No money will be exchanged on site. Details of how to set up a ParentPay account will be sent before the summer. We will provide the children with a water bottle and jotter on the first day, as well as their House badge and their timetable. The school day will end at 2:45pm... Bring on September!

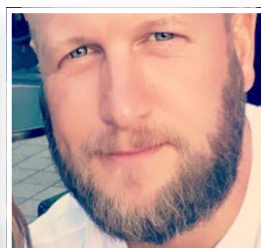
Governors
