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








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### **Christian Vision**

### **The Academy Day**

Being fully equipped is essential for learning! There are several items that we expect you to bring into school to ensure you are fully prepared to learn. You will need to bring a school bag or rucksack containing the following items each day you attend TASE. Please also bring your P.E kit on the days that you have P.E and extra-curricular. (This will not be on your first day at the academy).

### Equipment you need each day:

Knowledge Organiser, Academy Jotter, pens, pencils, ruler, reading book, and your P.E kit when needed.

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### Attendance

Students should only be absent if they have a really good reason for being away. Research shows that students with attendance over 96% produce the best results at GCSE. Therefore, being in lessons will help your child with their learning. Student attendance will appear in school reports and is reported to colleges or employers when they leave school.

If there is a problem that prevents your child attending, there is always someone in school that you can talk to about it. Please get in touch in the first instance with your child's Form Tutor or Student Liaison Officer. The pastoral team will always help you and your child get the support you may need to be in school every day.

# To achieve their very best, students must be on time and in school every day.

**Every student will receive a 100% attendance badge at the start of the year, the aim is to keep it.** If a student misses a day, they will have to give their badge back. Attendance over 96% will be rewarded, as will attendance improvements. The academy and our policy make reasonable adjustments for any student with SEND or medical needs that could prevent attendance at school.

### **Illness & Medical Appointments**



# If your child is ill, please call the academy before 9.00am the same day or message school via the MCAS app.

For absences known in advance, e.g. a medical appointment, a note must be provided. This should be presented to Reception/Student Liaison Officer before a student can sign out. Students must sign back in at Reception on their return. If your child is not at school, we need to make sure they are safe. We will text or telephone you to ensure you are aware that they are not in school. It is our duty to investigate unexplained absences either through school or the Education Welfare Team.

### **Holidays in Term Time**



### We will NOT authorise holidays in term time.

Any holidays taken during term time will be classed as unauthorised absence from school. You will also be subjected to a fixed penalty notice fine. Any student who takes a term time holiday will not be allowed to take part in any visit, excursion or reward trip for the next rolling calendar year from when the holiday is taken. Children's education is too important to miss for a holiday.



Punctuality

If students arrive after 8.25am they will be registered as late.

We value punctuality for several reasons: it ensures that lessons start on the most positive footing, it avoids classroom disruption, and it minimises wasted time for both students and teaching staff. ### Uniform

A visual guide to our uniform expectations can be found below. A more detailed guide will be placed on the website and please read the uniform policy document.

### **TASE** Tie

Academy ties must be worn at all times.

### Shirts/Blouses

All students must wear a white cotton shirt or blouse with a buttoned collar. This can be long or short sleeved.

### **School Blazer**

Students must wear the academy blazer at all times with the sleeves rolled down. We encourage students to wear their pin badges on their blazers.

### **Trousers**

Trousers must be straight legged, black polyester or cotton material with no decoration. Skin-tight trousers are not permitted. Trousers should be long enough to cover socks and ankles.

### Shoes

Shoes must be all black, flat and without any buckles, logos or decorative features. They must not be trainer variety or casual style shoes.

### Skirts

Only a black, pleated, knee-length skirt is to be worn. Black tights must be worn at all times.

### Not allowed!

Items made from denim, sweatshirts, hooded tops, sportswear, cardigans or jumpers are not allowed and will be confiscated if worn within the academy grounds. Clothing must not be decorated with pictures, logos, slogans or your own badges.

### Uniform

### Jewellery

The only items of jewellery allowed are plain wrist watches and one silver or gold ear stud worn in each earlobe.

All other items of jewellery including visible piercings are not allowed. Students will not be permitted to cover piercings with plasters. Piercings must be removed. Any student wearing nail varnish will be asked to remove it with products supplied by the academy. False nails of any description are not permitted.

Hair must be neat and tidy with no 'extreme' styles e.g. two-tone colours or unnatural colours.

Fashion styles, including very short hair with patterns cut into the hair are not permitted. Hair braiding and hair fashion items such as large clips and bows are not allowed. Long hair must be tied back in practical lessons for health and safety reasons.

### Tops:

Students must wear black football socks for all P.E lessons.


# 4 Footwear:

### **Behaviour and Expectations**

We also expect our community to respect our building and surroundings. No-one should drop any litter and chewing gum is banned on the academy site.




The only drink allowed in the academy will be water. We have water fountains. Please bring your own water bottle.

### **Behaviour and Expectations**

**In lessons we have a warning system.** If you do not behave in a way that reflects our Absolutes you will be given a verbal warning. If a student continues to show a lack of focus, they will be given a second warning and a negative behaviour point. If they need a further warning, they will be given an after-school detention. Staff also have the right to award a detention for unpleasant or silly behaviour, or any other occurrence that doesn't follow our school ethos and Absolutes.

All detentions are taken the same day as the incident occurred. They last for one hour after school. If a student misses the detention they are given a two-hour detention for the next day. **Please see our Behaviour for Learning policy on the website for a more detailed breakdown.** 





We expect our students to do daily home study but this will only be set by teachers on a few occasions. We expect that every night our students will read their current reading book for 30 mins and complete their Knowledge Organiser. We also expect them to be going through their Knowledge Organisers and remembering all the key information for every subject they are studying. At the start of every lesson they will be asked to recall this information and every half term they will sit a Masters of Recall multiple choice quiz as a year group to check their learning.

### Parents

We ask parents/carers to join in with their home study, to test students on their key knowledge and to listen to them read. We know this type of home study in the early years will boost their ability to read and write, and will boost their long term memory and understanding of key knowledge.
