
will be on sale soon and will sell out fast!



Steps

Part of the work we do around teaching great behaviour and manners is to focus on our STEPS. We pride ourselves on using good manners and I constantly hear from members of the public and visitors to the school about how polite and respectful our children are, and what beautiful manners they have.

Every week in form time we focus on one of the letters and think about how we can display our manners. Next week we focus on our children saying 'Please' when they require something from their friends or from staff. Please do follow suit if you like at home and focus on the same STEP that we are.



Maths Award

We pride ourselves on our STEM specialism and maths is an integral part of that. We focus on maths mastery and the children benefit from exceptional teaching from specialist staff. Our Trust owns the company 'White Rose Education', so we benefit by getting the latest resources and training. As part of our mastery approach, we have been designated as a problem-solving school. Our approach will focus more on teaching problem solving abilities to children that they can apply to maths and real life. Another fantastic accolade for our school and the TASE maths team.



Home learning

I do hope that you see the benefit of our approach to home learning and using a knowledge organiser to learn new knowledge which then enables children to apply it to subject related questions. We feel it helps to organise the children's time and does not overwhelm them. I also hope that it supports you as parents to keep on top of their home learning. Below are a few points that could support you further in helping your child with their masters of recall work.

Masters of Recall

Students learn the weekly knowledge in their knowledge organiser using the self-quizzing process of look, cover, write, check, correct. This is completed in their yellow recall book. They must then answer the recall questions in their knowledge organiser, from memory. If they cannot answer the questions, then they need to go back and learn the knowledge again. Family and friends can support at home by quizzing and questioning. Termly knowledge organisers can be found on the TASE website.

Yellow recall books and knowledge organiser questions will be checked every Monday morning in form time. All subjects must to be completed in full each week.

At the end of each term, students complete a 'Masters of Recall Big Quiz'.


What does look, cover, write, check, correct mean?

	Look	Look at the information carefully. Read it three times.
₩	Cover	It may help to say it as you read it. Cover it with your hand or a piece of paper.
2	Write	Write it out, from memory.
Ø	Check	Check what you have written matches the information exactly. Have you got it correct? If so, tick your work to show it is correct.
	Correct	If it doesn't match exactly, use your purple pen to correct it. Repeat. When you get it 100% correct, move on to the next piece of information.
