Here is the link to the Eventbrite site to buy your tickets. Any children who are performing do not need to buy a ticket but their family members, like all the audience will.



Please ensure no products contain alcohol.




Please bring any items, shoe boxes or full shoeboxes by Wednesday 13th December. Items can be dropped off in the
