COMPUTING AWARD


We received some fantastic news last week. The TASE computing department have been awarded the Computing Quality Mark in recognition for delivering high-quality computing education to young people, developing their digital skills and preparing them for the future.

The Computing Quality Mark is awarded by the National Centre for Computing Education and recognises excellence of computing education offered by a school as part of their curriculum development through the Computing Quality Framework.
