# LABOUR MARKET INFORMATION

Please see below the current Labour Market Information (LMI) for Barnsley. Labour market information tells you what the workplace looks like. LMI is data taken from publicly available sources, which gives information on jobs and industries. This helps us understand the structural trends and demands of an economy. Labour market information describes the condition of the labour market currently and makes future predictions. It informs us where work opportunities are increasing or decreasing, what occupations exist, what you need to study to get into that occupation, what is required to take up an occupation, how you can find a job, change job or progress in a career. Labour markets operate at local, regional, national and now at international levels. Labour market information can be overwhelming and confusing. Learning what it is and how to use it can assist you in helping your child research careers and find out where those careers exist.



# **GENERAL UPDATES**

From Friday 23rd of February we will be implementing a process around school meal accounts that are in debt. If your child's account goes overdrawn by up to £5, we will remind you to top it up. If that debt continues to rise and reaches £20 their account will be blocked and they will not be able to purchase anything, and you will be required to send them with a packed lunch. There are several accounts in debt now and we will be writing to you to set up repayment plans for these.

Children have been taking part in 'student voice' activities this week. We regularly ask their opinion and gauge their feeling on behaviour, lessons, safety and so on. We scrutinise the results and use our Student Senior Leadership Team and School Council to investigate any issues or ideas and these get fed back to myself and the Senior Leadership Team. After Easter, the trust will be sending all parents a link to complete survey too about our school and your feelings. Please watch out for this and please do share your thoughts so we can work together to continue to offer an outstanding education and experience for the children.

I have spoken to mainly Y9 this week and a few other students about our jewellery rules. Please can you support us in reinforcing these. Only one set of studs are allowed any other piercings and rings are not permitted. I have explained to children that after half term we will confiscate any rings worn until the end of the day. I explained to the children that bracelets and necklaces should not be seen. If children are wearing dangly charm bracelets, we will again confiscate these. I have explained that if they are worn below their shirt cuffs and collars and we don't see them, there is no issue.

Finally, can I please ask that all parents conduct telephone conversations in a calm and respectful manner. I appreciate the call may be to identify a concern, or because you are unhappy with a decision we have made. We will always strive to resolve any issue for you, and we will commit to speaking to you in a calm and respectful way. Can I ask that you do the same. Staff do not come to work to be shouted at on the phone nor spoken to in a derogatory way. Thank you to those of you who always conduct your communications with us in a respectful manner. It is appreciated.
