performance from all involved.










# LENT

#### REPORTS

A group of parents have asked for a brief explanation of the what the 'on target', 'working towards' and 'above target' statement means. For example, a student may have a % score of 86% and their target statement may still say 'on target'. Below is an explanation for you. When you receive your child's report you will see this section below which aims to explain what the targets mean.

**Section One:** this shows the overall percentage students achieved in their latest assessment. It is used alongside students' starting points at the academy and compared with other students of similar ability to generate their Overall Progress. The report contains information about their Attitude to Learning and how hard they are working in class. You may also see some codes for suggestions of how your child could improve further in some areas.

The report shows their overall percentage score achieved in their latest assessment. This is then used alongside student's individual starting point and it is compared with other students of similar ability at TASE to generate their overall progress grade. This is not given by individual teachers. Two students may have scored the same percentage score but have a different progress grade as this is personal to their own starting point. Likewise, students may have the same progress grade but achieved different percentage scores on the assessment. The target statement is relevant to each student's performance in line with their starting point at TASE in comparison to students of a similar ability to them when they too entered TASE.
