STEM INDUSTRIAL CADETS

Four of our student STEM ambassadors from Year 9 started their project this week where they had their first online training session. The 12-week project will allow students to gain key skills for learning, life and working as a team on a set STEM project. Students will learn about potential future career paths and the exciting STEM opportunities available to them, working alongside an industry mentor. At the end of the scheme, students graduate as Bronze-level Industrial Cadets, a nationally recognised award that students can use as evidence of their experience and take forward to complement their future applications and career journeys.

PARACETAMOL AND MEDICINES



After half term we will not be administering paracetamol to any students during the school day. If your child requires medication due to an injury or it is prescribed by a GP, it needs to be sent with them in a marked envelope and they need to hand it in to reception. We will no longer allow students to take paracetamol supplied by school, even with permission from a parent. We will always aim to support children who feel unwell, we are however not a pharmacy and there have been too many occasions where children (who have parental permission) are coming to reception for medication. Any child who needs regular medication that has been previous agreed, and it is part of their medical plan, will of course still be supported.
